Pedestrian Transportion & Traffic – Paul Kropp

- Plan Commission forwarded the update to the 6-year plan; most 2016 & 2017, including:
 - Ray Street from 17th to the bottom of hill
- Centennial Trail crossing at Mission Avenue stakeholder group recommended building a bridge eventually over Mission. Stage 1 is to separate trail from street.
- Regional Transportation Plan updated 2 years ago by STRC which gives them the basis to set standards regarding bicycle and pedestrian facilities. The effect will be that the jurisdictions must be accountable for all forms of transportation (not just autos).

Land Use Committee Update – Kerry Brooks/Ted Teske

Southeast Sports Complex "Visioning"

- Landscaper contracted with city has engaged with sports users, SNC Land Use
 Committee in the last few weeks
- o Public Meeting, Tuesday, May 19th, 7:00pm at ESD 101 on Regal Street.
 - Workshop Encourage neighbors to attend
 - Neighborhood opportunity to give input on what we would like to see
 - Ted is going to make up a flyer to post in area apartment complexes
- Will present data from public meeting at SNC June meeting

44th Avenue Trail/Havana Water Main Update

- Tentative start date on June 8
- Kerry and Kyle met with city assured that the trail will be lowered to former level;
 crossing will be made at 44th and Freya with pedestrian island
- City forester will revegetate with drought-tolerant bush-trees. Greystone subdivision will apply for greening and are willing to commit to irrigating until plants are established.

Dirt Piles on Douglass Property

 Illegally dumped dirt is being moved to 57th & Palouse. Dirt originally from old Regal Lumber site.

Black property at 57th and Ben Burr

 received a grading permit so dirt can be left indefinitely. Two previous temporary permits had expired.

Annexation was approved to include Palouse Hwy to Regal from 53rd to 55th by city.

• Note: Regal Lumber site now in the city.

Ben Burr Park Playground

 Small playground was destroyed by fire; new equipment should be installed before Havanna work started

- Discussed moving forward with bringing our appeal to the hearing examiner
