#### **NEIGHBORHOOD BUSINESS**

### Traffic Calming Funds - Breann Beggs, City Councilperson

- Projects that were approved for 2016 are twice as much as budgeted
- Added two cameras for speeding around schools, estimate over \$1 million this year (doesn't click on until 28 MPH in 20 MPH zone)
- How to use this money?
  - Half (\$500,000) will be used for traffic calming around schools
  - Proposal to use other hand to hire four additional neighborhood resource officers to deter property crimes.
  - Discussion:
    - Half of funds would be used for school-related traffic calming and half for neighborhood resource officer, ongoing funding
    - One traffic officer was added in 2016
    - Neighborhood Resource Officers' duties vary from location to location, two on south hill, officers work independently on neighborhood problems that are specific
      - For example, one follows transient camps, abandoned properties
      - Not tied to a radio to answer calls
      - Job descriptions are being developed
      - Are more lights going to be added to other schools?
         Schools have been ranked by safety. Hopefully people would modify their behavior and fewer tickets would be issued.
      - What would be the impact on traffic calming? It will double the traffic calming each year (with half given to neighborhood resource officer).
      - Is neighborhood crime going down? Small uptick but overall, crime is down. Citizens feel that crime is going up.
    - Straw Poll:
      - Favor splitting funds between school-related traffic calming and neighborhood resource officers: 16 in favor; 0 against

# Land Use Committee Update – Kerry Brooks/Ted Teske

#### Vaughn Traffic Scoping Meeting, October 12, 2016

- o Large turn out; standing room only
- Traffic rate questioned by county agencies; question about calling drive-through restaurants a shopping center; negotiating to call drivethru restaurant casual restaurants
- New traffic study being done, report projected to be released in a couple months
- Traffic impacts from previously built projects and background projects were not included (KXLY project, Maverick gas station, new apartments, Target, etc.)
- o No new information given
- o Developer wants traffic light at 53<sup>rd</sup> to move high volumes of traffic into their site.
- Attendees expressed frustration about traffic on Regal; no space for additional lanes; SNC would like to develop a detailed traffic plan for comprehensive South Hill that includes all of the cumulative effects of all of the development in the City and County
- o Per Breann Beggs, this project is on the monthly agenda of Planning and Economic Development
- o Ranked the road service level as an F
- o Todd Whipple said there will be another public meeting in a few months to review the findings

o Comment: Every project should have a reservation in the city concurrency management system (is it in the 6-year plan?)
