#### **PRESENTATIONS**

## City Council Representative Presentation - Lori Kinear

- Property Crimes Supervision Bill (spearheaded by Lori) was signed on April 29, 2019. Auto theft offenders will be supervised under a pilot project for two years. Services will be provided to parolees as needed. Effective 90 days from signing of bill.
- Regal Street is on the 6-year street plan for 2019.
- What is being planned about the people who are harassing people downtown:
  - Two separate groups homeless and criminals who are not necessarily homeless.
  - Envision Center will be opened to help homeless individuals.
  - Police are dealing with criminals, bike cops are now patrolling.
  - Mental health professionals paired with police.
- Spokane Matters initiative started by mayor, each district meets to determine projects in each district. On April 30, 2019, determined projects to work on:
  - District 2: 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue Connectivity Project: Lower south hill scoping project near the medical district for safe connectivity. Spearheaded by Mulitcare Deaconess. Involves the Tiger Trail from Woldson Park, above Lewis & Clark High School, Ronald McDonald House and hospitals.
  - Dog park template that could be applied to any park.
- City Council hearing on May 6 for map amendment.
- Garden District hearing will be a few days later.

### Spokane Police Department Report – Det. Bob Mossman

 Asked what do we do with a criminal who is mentally ill, not taking medications and found not competent to stand trial? Discussion on options.

- Where do we voice our opinions? Any city council member, mayor and tell them that we need more police officers.
- Situation is not remedial within the criminal justice system and recourse is outside of the criminal system.
- Needs to be a change in the law.
