 - Under construction
 - Ben Burr Trail closed until late October
 - Alternate route for children going to Moran Prairie

Notes from the CA meeting - July 11, 2019

21 Neighborhoods present

Patricia Hansen resigned as liaison to the Planning Commission – the CA is looking for replacements.

5 Comp Plan amendments are being considered, two are of city-wide interest: 1) increased density usage in the transportation corridors and 2) identifying expanded areas where General Commercial zoning can be used.

Two Town Halls for the Law and justice Administration are planned – July 31 and August 1

The Fall Retreat for the CA will be October 14 from 9-1, location to be determined – will review NUSA.

Brean Beggs - County may help with funding for the new Homeless Shelter at Sprague and Havana, also the City of Spokane Valley may help. They will likely re-open a downtown precinct. School zone radar red money is increasing, and there will be more cameras. We can apply now for spending it.

July 31 = District 2 meeting for CA/CD coordination.

There has been review of SPD "Use of force" policies – no big changes

There will be a broadening of criteria for Multi-Family Tax Exemption funding for development of new 4-plexes – "affordability" is an issue – opportunity zones will be expanded – "target zones" will be merged – general attempt to expand living choices within a neighborhood. State has changed some laws to protect condo builders.

Does the SNC have a "flag?"

CA Meeting notes - August 1, 2019

22 neighborhoods present.

A speaker from Strong Towns is coming September 10.

There will be a hearing on Impact Fees sponsored by the Planning Commission on August 14. Also, the PC needs two new members.

There are some changes to the Arterial Map to align with the Comp Plan. 4th Avenue behind Fred Meyer upgraded – 17th from Ray to Carnahan will be upgraded – 27th behind the shopping center will get stop signs or something? Cedar Street in Kendall Yards and a few others.

All but four District Two Neighborhood Councils met with Lori Kinnear on July 31, to try to set our goals and policies for spending the \$200,000 in CDBG money. I believe we were not represented.

Shelter on E Sprague is not yet purchased, but \$50,000 has been allocated to study it!!

Three new staff members at ONS – Annica Eagle, Taylor Berbekis and Alex Mann.

The North Bank Plan is being worked on – connectivity, housing, public spaces, visibility, walkability etc. Ther will likely be no minimum parking requirements. A consultant team is working on a subarea plan.

The National Association of Realtors is planning a meeting at the Ramada Inn Airport – topic will be abandoned properties – August 15, 8AM to 4PM.
