2026 Park Levy Update

- Spokane voters approved the Parks & Recreation levy in November. When the first levy installment arrives in May, the City is ready to hit the ground running. The levy projects will be phased over 20 years. Timing of improvements will be based on current conditions and spread evenly between districts.
