- Starting July 14, Spokane City Council meeting days change.
 - Council Agenda Review Meetings are now on Tuesdays at 11 a.m.
 - Council Committee Meetings are now on Tuesdays at 1 p.m.
 - Council Legislative Sessions are now on Wednesdays at 6 p.m.

July Fourth Holiday Closures & Events (7/4):

- City Hall and Waste to Energy Facility will be closed.
- On-street parking meters and kiosks will not require payments, but please adhere to time limits.
- Garbage, recycling, and food & yard waste services will proceed as usual.
- The City's six aquatic centers will be closed.
- Splash pads and golf courses will remain open.
- Riverfront Park attractions including the Loeff Carrousel, the Numerica SkyRide, and the Numerica Skate Ribbon will be open on the Fourth of July Details are available [online](#).

Summer Watering Schedule:

- Watering rules run from June through October and follow the even/odd schedule. Even addresses water on even days and odd addresses water on odd days.
 - Level 1
 - No outdoor watering between the hours of 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.
 - Limit watering to no more than four days within a week.
 - Suggested best practice of no more than a total of two hours watering per day.
 - Suggested excluding using water to clean hardscapes such as: sidewalks, driveways, decks, and patios.
 - Level 2 (*When the Spokane River is below 1,000 CFS (cubic feet per second)*)
 - No outdoor watering between the hours of 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.
 - Limit watering to no more than two days within a week.
 - No more than a total of two hours watering per day.
 - No using water to clean hardscapes such as: sidewalks, driveways, decks, and patios.

Fall Disposal Passes

- Fall disposal passes will be handed out at the July Community Assembly (CA) meeting. If your Neighborhood Council will not have a representative attend the July CA meeting, please contact Amber Groe (agroe@spokanecity.org) and she will coordinate with you about receiving your passes. Each neighborhood will receive 17 passes, a \$510 value. Fall disposal passes can be distributed beginning on Tuesday, August 4 through Saturday, October 31.
- NOTE – for Southgate residents: Because we do not meet in July or August, the 17 passes will be distributed via US Mail, starting on August 4. Please use the “Leave a comment” option under the post title (for any post) to provide your physical mailing address to the Council. **No requests for passes will be honored if sent via the “Comment” option before 12:01 AM on August 4.** Requests for passes will be honored and mailed in the order received. Another post will appear when all passes have been claimed. The hard copy passes expire on
